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# Introduction

## What is the Lexia League?

**The Lexia League is a fun, half-term competition designed to encourage regular engagement with Lexia and celebrate your pupils' commitment to their literacy learning.**

The challenge is simple: **Complete as many Lexia units as possible during the competition period.**

By creating a shared goal and celebrating achievement, you can use the Lexia League to establish strong learning routines at the start of the academic year, while using the myLexia reporting platform to monitor engagement and progress.

At the end of the competition, you can identify your highest-performing pupil based on the number of Lexia units completed and enter them for national recognition! Top-performing pupils will be recognised as **Lexia Superstars**.

## Who is it for?

The Lexia League is open to **all schools in the UK and Ireland using Lexia programmes.**

You can adapt the competition to suit your school. You might run it across the whole school, within individual classes or across particular year groups.

However you choose to run your competition, the aim is the same: Encourage regular engagement with Lexia and celebrate the effort your pupils put into developing their literacy skills.

## Why get involved?

The Lexia League gives you a simple way to bring extra energy to literacy while supporting positive learning habits.

Taking part can help you:

- **Encourage regular Lexia use** and establish consistent learning routines.
- **Motivate your pupils** with a clear and achievable goal.
- **Celebrate effort and achievement** in literacy.
- **Maintain engagement** throughout the competition period.
- **Use myLexia data** to monitor units completed and recognise pupil achievement.
- **Celebrate success across your school and beyond**, giving pupils an opportunity to see their hard work recognised.

The Lexia League gives you an opportunity to encourage your pupils to make the most of their time on Lexia and celebrate their achievements along the way.

## Prizes

The top-performing pupils will be recognised for their achievement and receive:

- **£25 National Book Token** for qualifying winners
- **£50 National Book Token** for the overall winner
- **Lexia Superstar pin badge**
- **Certificate of achievement**
- **Recognition in a LexiaUK blog** celebrating top-performing pupils



**Please note:** Your school's entry must be based on the number of Lexia units completed between 1st September and 12th October 2026. Make sure you use the relevant date range when checking your myLexia data.

# Tips for Running Your School's Lexia League Competition

The Lexia League is designed to be straightforward to run alongside your existing use of Lexia. Here are some ideas to help you get the most from the competition.

## 1 Launch the competition together

Start by introducing your Lexia League in a school-wide setting, such as an assembly.

Explain what the competition is, how pupils can take part and what they are working towards. This is also a great opportunity to introduce the Lexia Superstar recognition, and prizes that are on offer and build excitement from the outset.

Keep the message simple: Use Lexia regularly, complete as many units as you can and celebrate your learning.

## 2 Make the competition visible

Use the posters and resources included in this pack to promote your Lexia League around school.

Display them in classrooms, corridors, libraries and other shared spaces. You could also include reminders in assemblies, newsletters or your school's usual digital communications.

Regular reminders will help keep the challenge visible and encourage your pupils to stay engaged throughout the competition.

## 3 Keep your leaderboard up to date

Use myLexia reports to monitor the number of units your pupils are completing during the competition.

The leaderboard templates in this pack can help you recognise leading pupils within individual classes or across the whole school.

You could also display your leaderboard on digital screens around school and update it regularly. This gives pupils a visible reminder of the challenge and an opportunity to see their achievements recognised.

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## Communicate the key information clearly

Make sure your pupils and staff know:

- When the competition starts
- When the competition ends
- How units are counted
- What prizes and recognition are available
- When you will announce the final results

Regular reminders in assemblies or class time can help maintain momentum as the competition progresses.

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## Celebrate along the way

You don't need to wait until the end of the competition to recognise achievement.

Consider introducing your own **mid-competition certificates or rewards** to celebrate pupils who are making great progress, completing milestones, using Lexia regularly to demonstrating a positive attitude towards their learning.

Recognising different types of achievement can help ensure that your competition remains positive and motivating for all pupils throughout the half term.

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## Most importantly, have fun!

Your Lexia League is an opportunity to make literacy learning visible and celebrate the commitment your pupils show to developing their skills.

Create a competition that works for your school, celebrate milestones and encourage pupils to support each other.

***However you choose to run your Lexia League, make it your own and enjoy celebrating your pupils' achievements.***

## Poster Template

Use the poster template included overleaf to help you promote your Lexia League around school.

Display your posters in classrooms, corridors and shared spaces to remind pupils about the competition and encourage regular engagement with Lexia.

Use the digital leaderboard templates included in this pack to recognise and celebrate your top-performing pupils.

You can use the templates to:

- Track your whole-school leaderboard
- Create individual class leaderboards
- Share the number of units completed
- Recognise pupils reaching important milestones
- Provide regular updates on digital displays around school

Use my Lexia data to update your leaderboard throughout the competition and help your pupils see their efforts recognised.

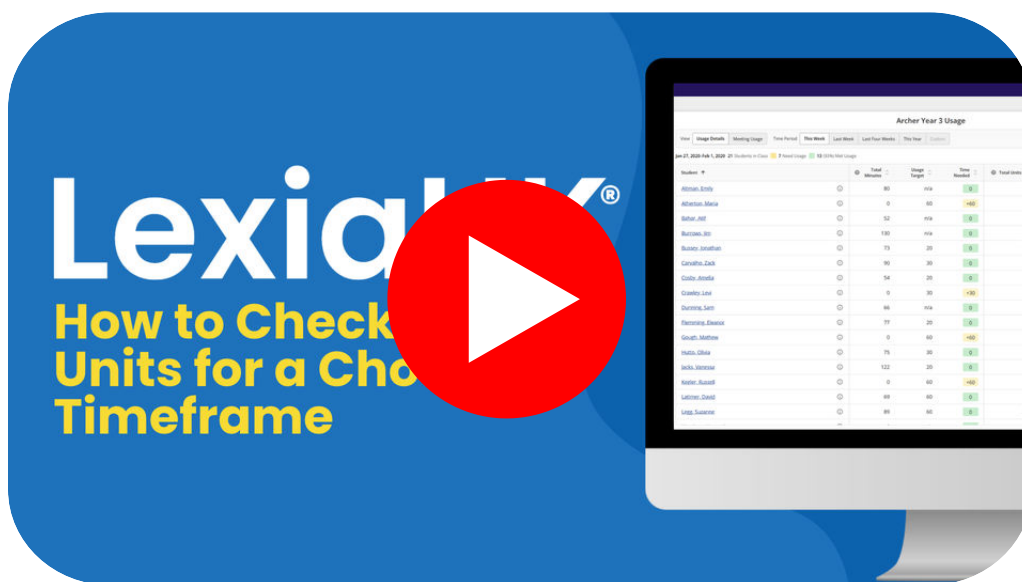

## Timeframe

**To identify your school's top-performing pupils, you'll need to check the number of Lexia units completed during the official competition period.**

The **Usage Report in myLexia** allows you to select a specific date range and see the activity completed during that time.

### Watch the how-to-video:



The video will show you how to:

1. Log in to myLexia and select a class.
2. Open the **Usage Report** available on the right of the class overview.
3. Select **Custom** under the Time Period options.
4. Enter the competition start and end dates (1<sup>st</sup> September 2026 – 12<sup>th</sup> October 2026) and click 'Apply'. If checking units mid-competition, select the current date as the end date.
5. Review the number of units completed during the selected period, use this data to update leaderboards throughout the competition and to submit your competition entry.
6. Export or print the report if required.

**Important:** When identifying your school's competition entry, make sure you use the number of units completed **within the official competition timeframe only**.

## Certificates

**Use the certificate templates included in this pack overleaf to recognise your pupils' achievements during your school's Lexia League competition.**

You can use certificates to recognise:

- Your school's top Lexia performer
- Class winners
- Pupils reaching a particular number of units
- Pupils showing consistent effort

Celebrating a range of achievements can help ensure that your competition remains positive and motivating for your pupils throughout the half term.

# What Happens Next?

Once your school competition has finished, it's time to identify your top-performing pupil and submit your entry to the Lexia League.

## 1 Identify your school's top performer

Use myLexia to check the number of units completed by your pupils during the official competition period.

You can submit **one pupil** as your school's Lexia League entry.

## 2 Submit your entry

Between **12–16 October 2026**, submit your school's highest-performing pupil using the official Lexia League entry form. This will be sent via email closer to the competition end date.

You'll need to provide:

- Pupil's first name
- Class, as displayed in myLexia
- Year group
- Number of Lexia units completed during the competition period

**Entry deadline: 16<sup>th</sup> October 2026 at 4pm.**

## 3 Keep your evidence

LexiaUK may contact selected schools to verify their results. You may be asked to provide supporting evidence, such as a screenshot of the relevant myLexia report.

We recommend keeping a copy of your final report until the competition has been completed.

## 4 Celebrate your Lexia Superstars

Selected pupils will be recognised as **Lexia Superstars** and may receive:

- A £25 National Book Token, with £50 awarded to the overall winner
- A Lexia Superstar pin badge
- A certificate of achievement
- Recognition in a LexiaUK blog celebrating top-performing pupils

All feature pupils will be celebrated in a blog published during the week after half term.
